



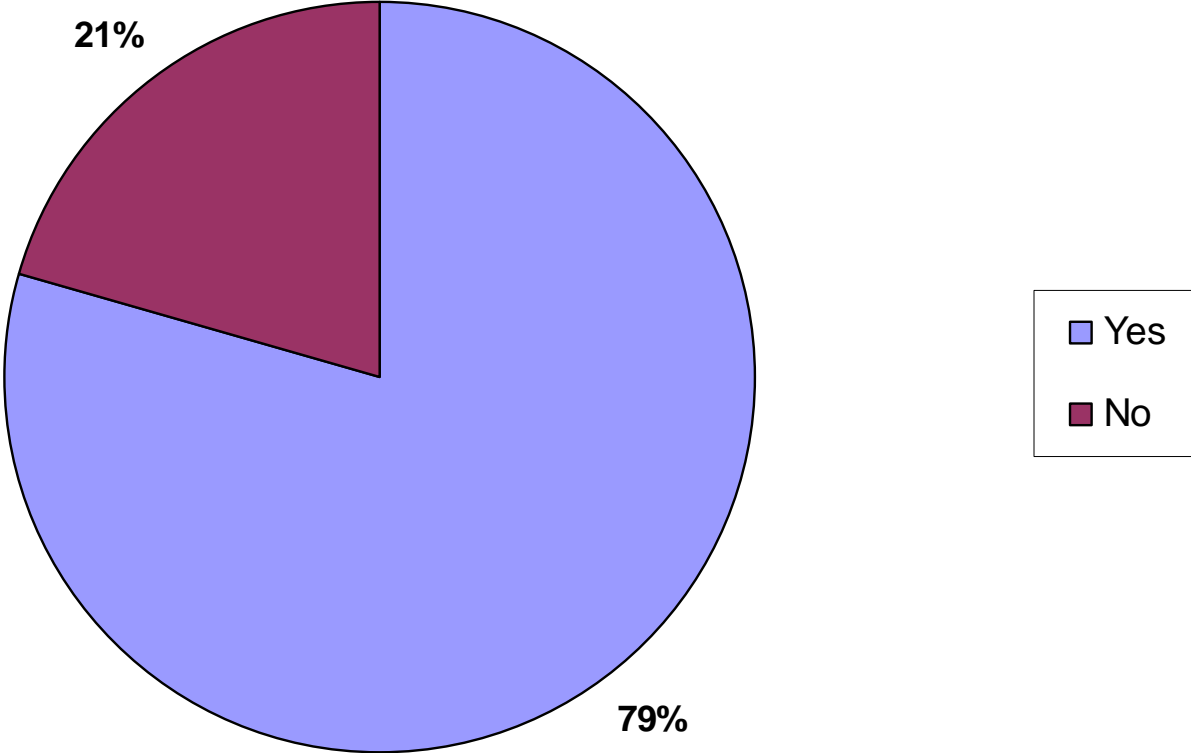

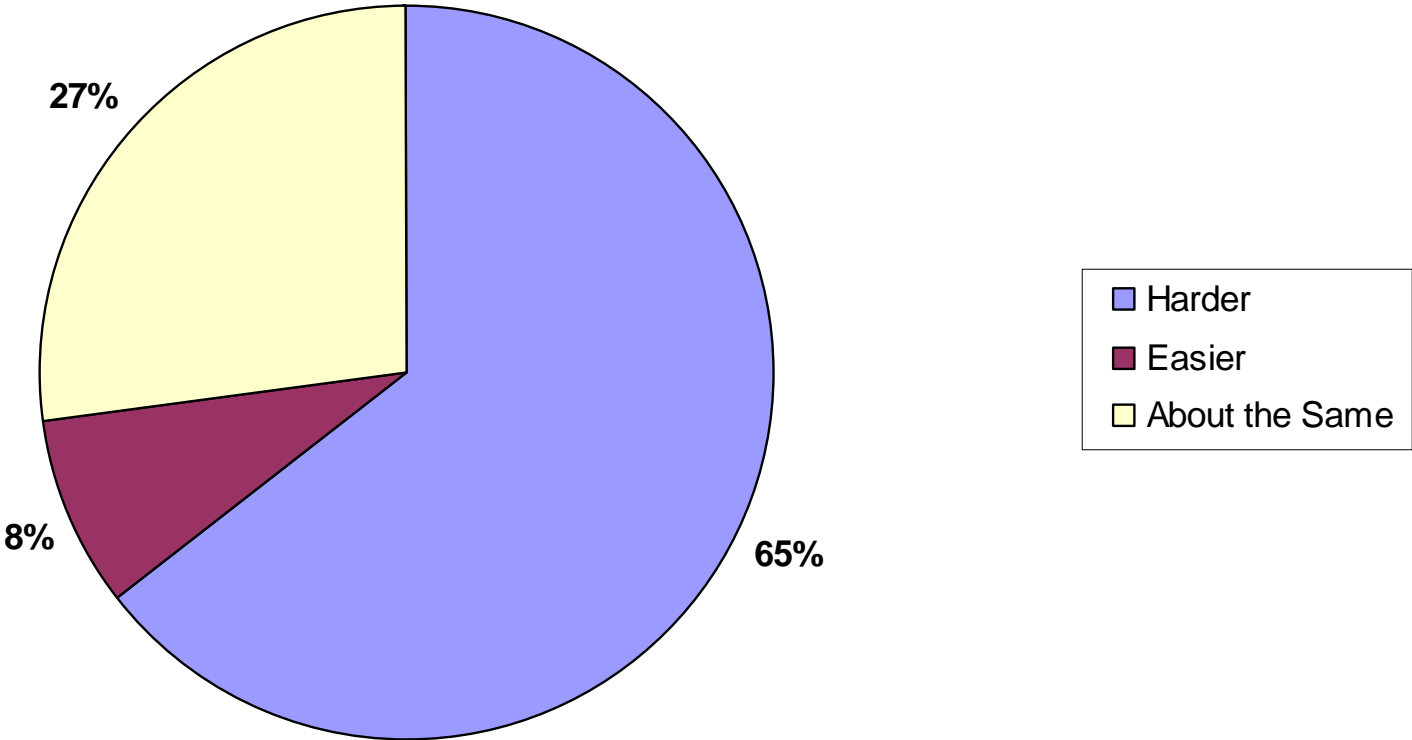
**Question 1: Are you in favor of large master planned communities in Ventura County as a way of managing growth?**

**Question Response Rate: 151/170 surveys (89 percent)**



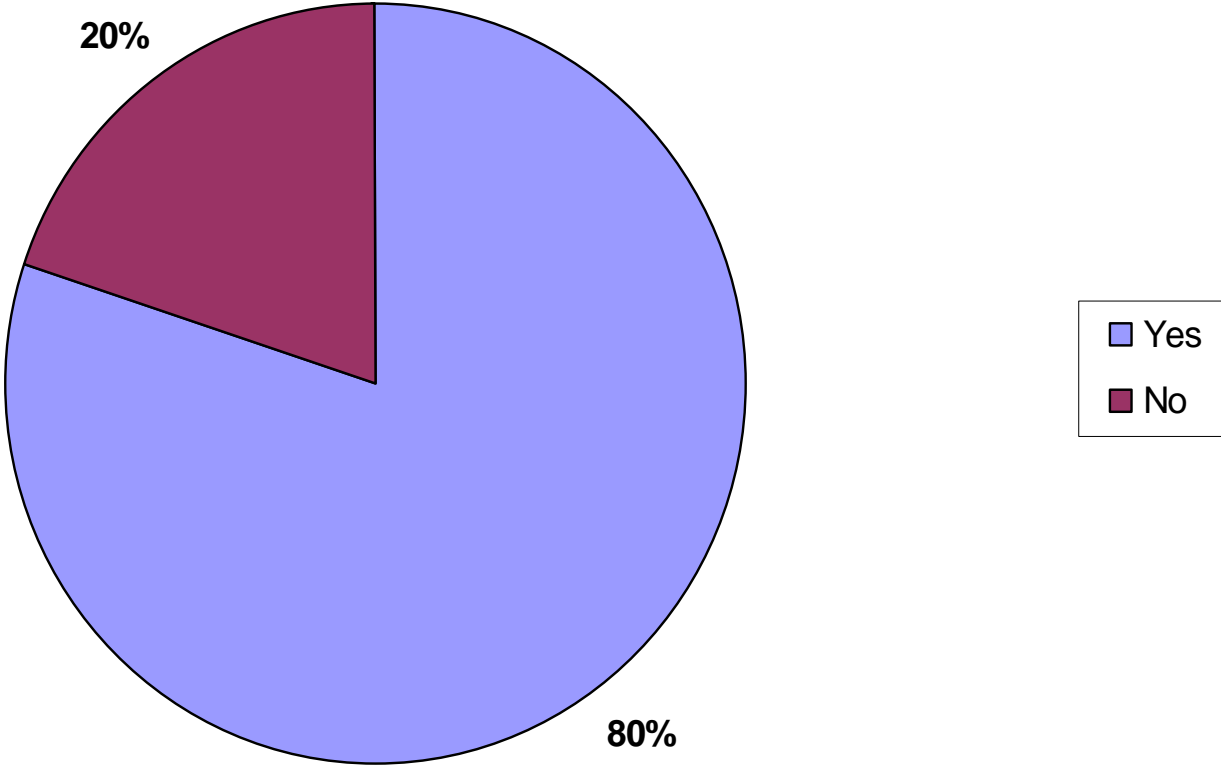
**Question 2: How would you compare the ease of developing in Ventura County compared to five years ago?**

**Question Response Rate: 143/170 surveys (84 percent)**



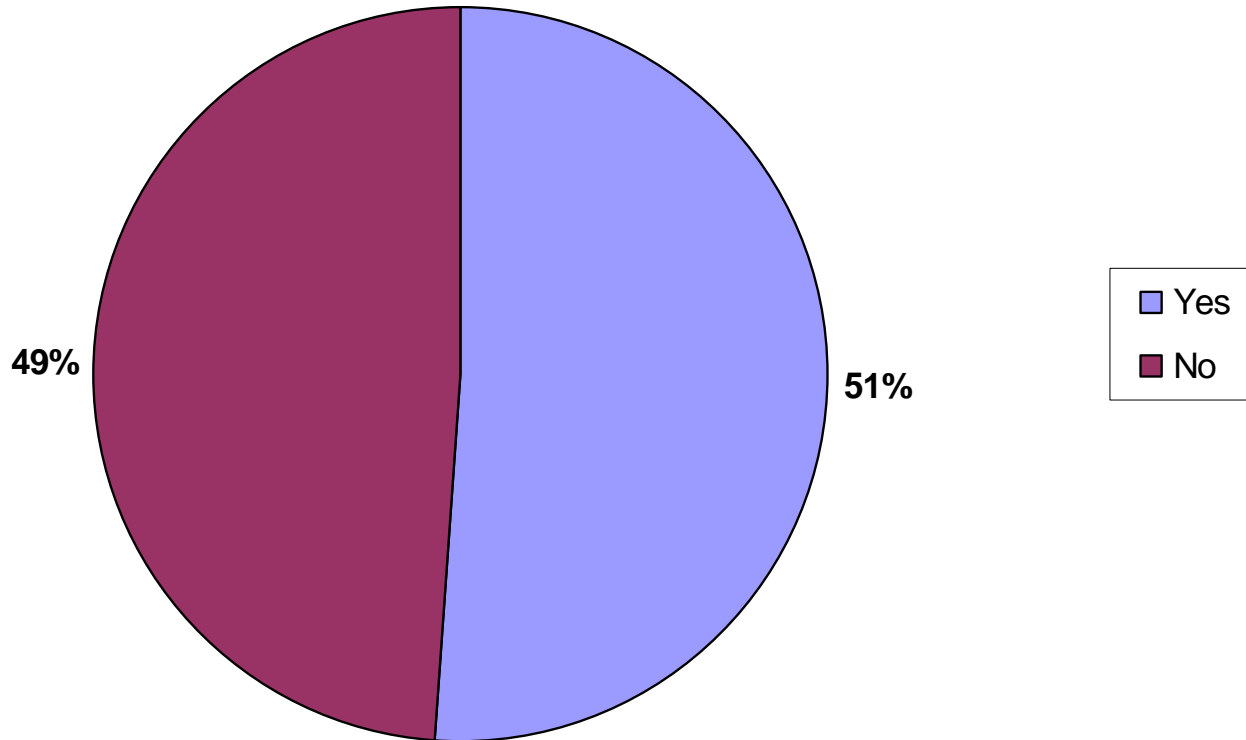
**Question 3: Do you support inclusionary housing requirements in new housing developments?**

**Question Response Rate: 161/170 surveys (95 percent)**



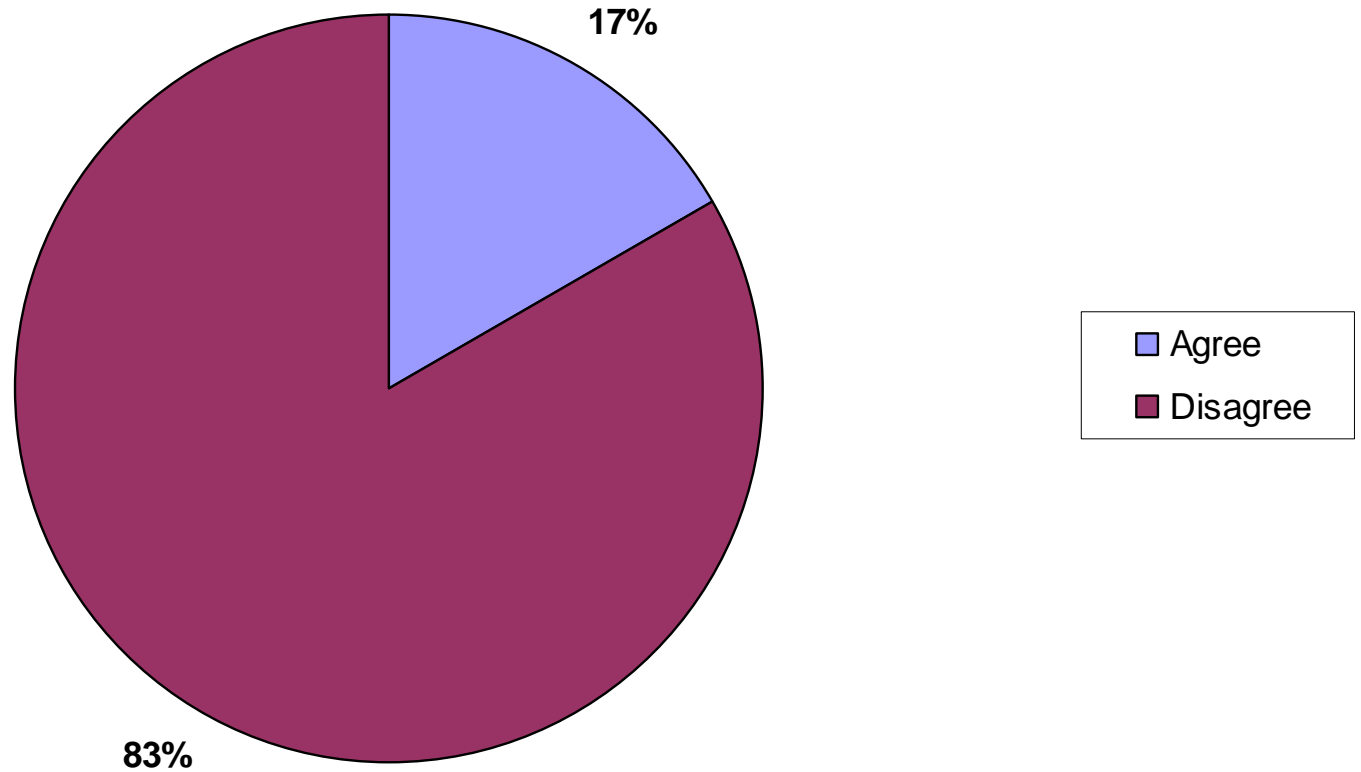
**Question 4: Do you believe that governmental planning regulation, review and control is producing better residential projects than five years ago?**

**Question Response Rate: 146/170 surveys (86 percent)**



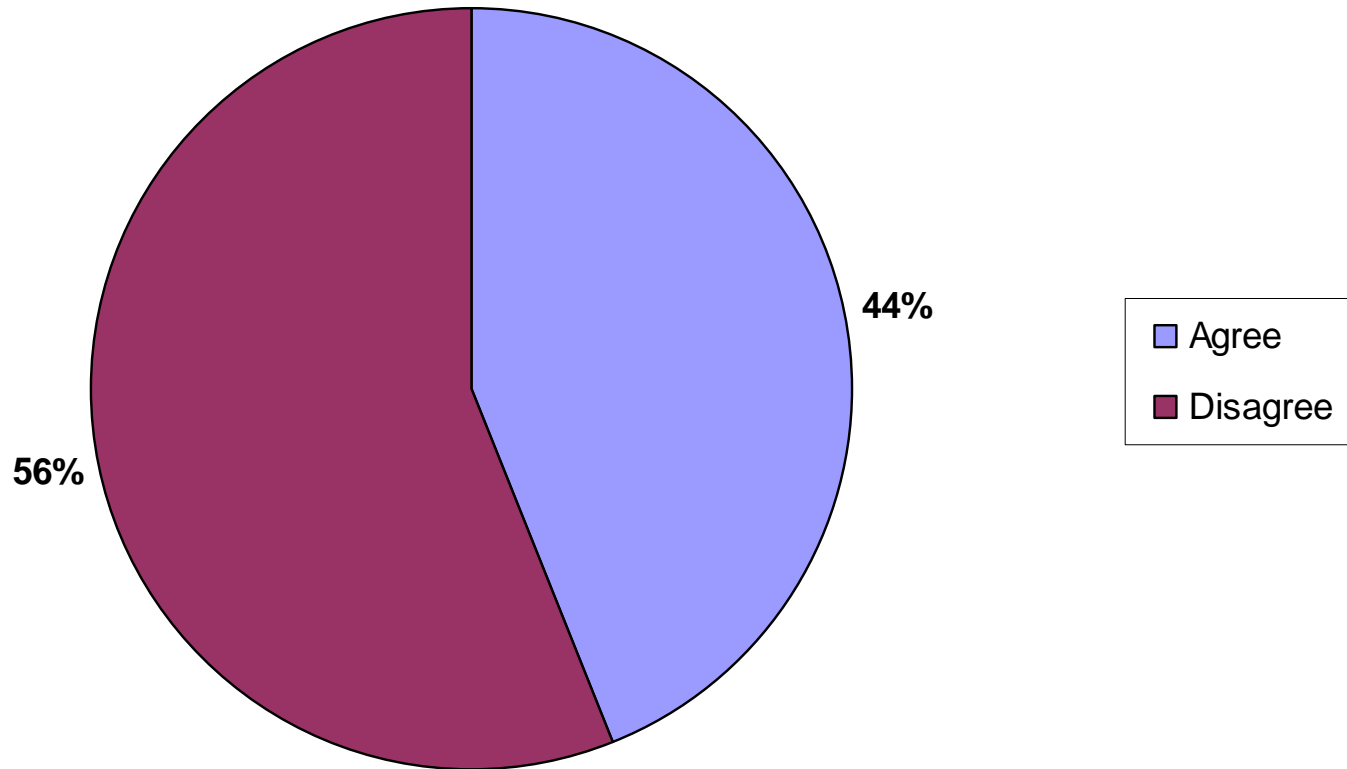
**"If there has to be housing growth, I'd rather limit it as low density even if it means less open space and agricultural land in the future."**

**Question Response Rate: 167/170 surveys (98 percent)**



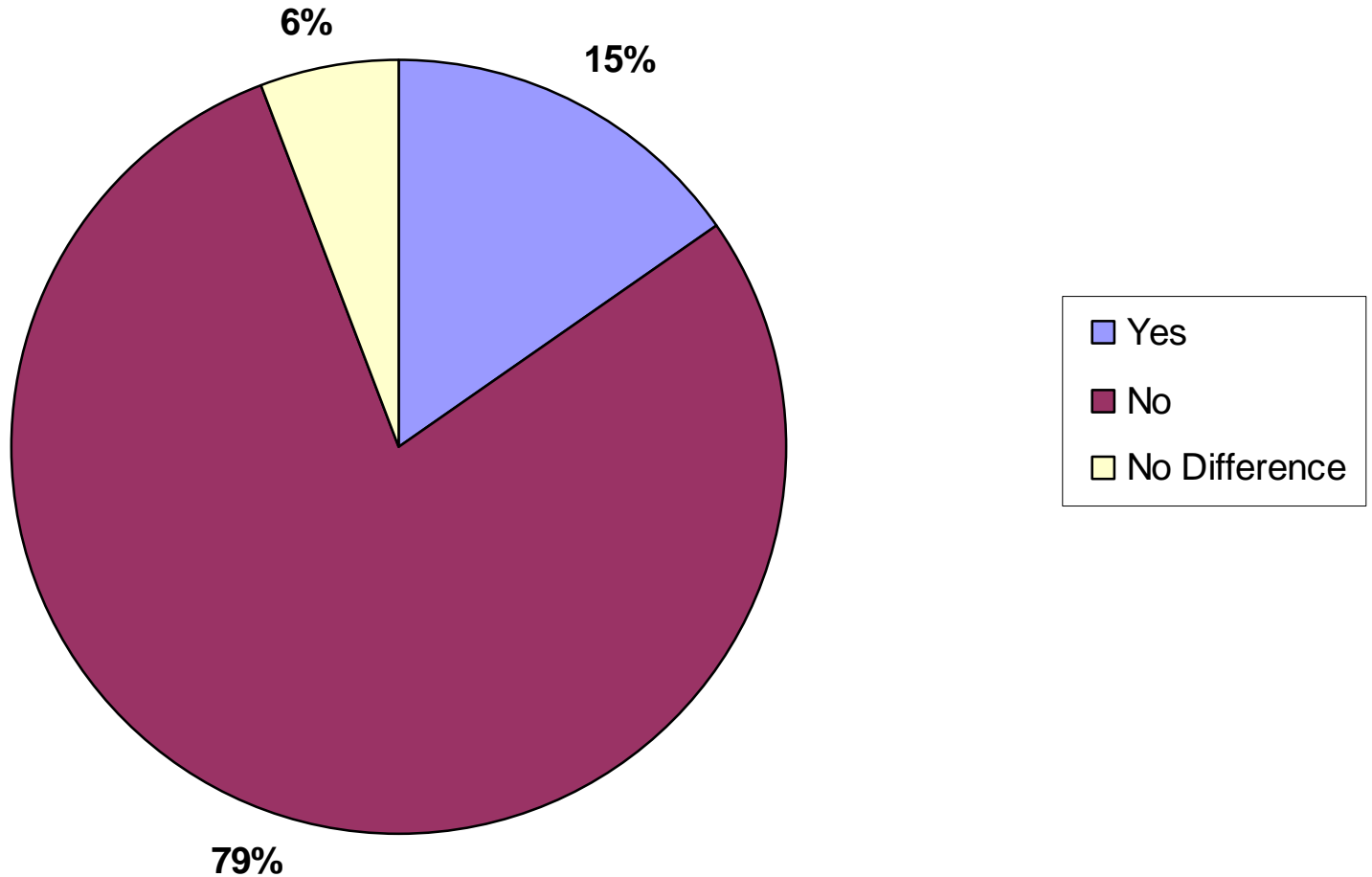
**Question 6: My elected officials generally represent my views on the development of new housing in Ventura County.**

**Question Response Rate: 141/170 surveys (83 percent)**



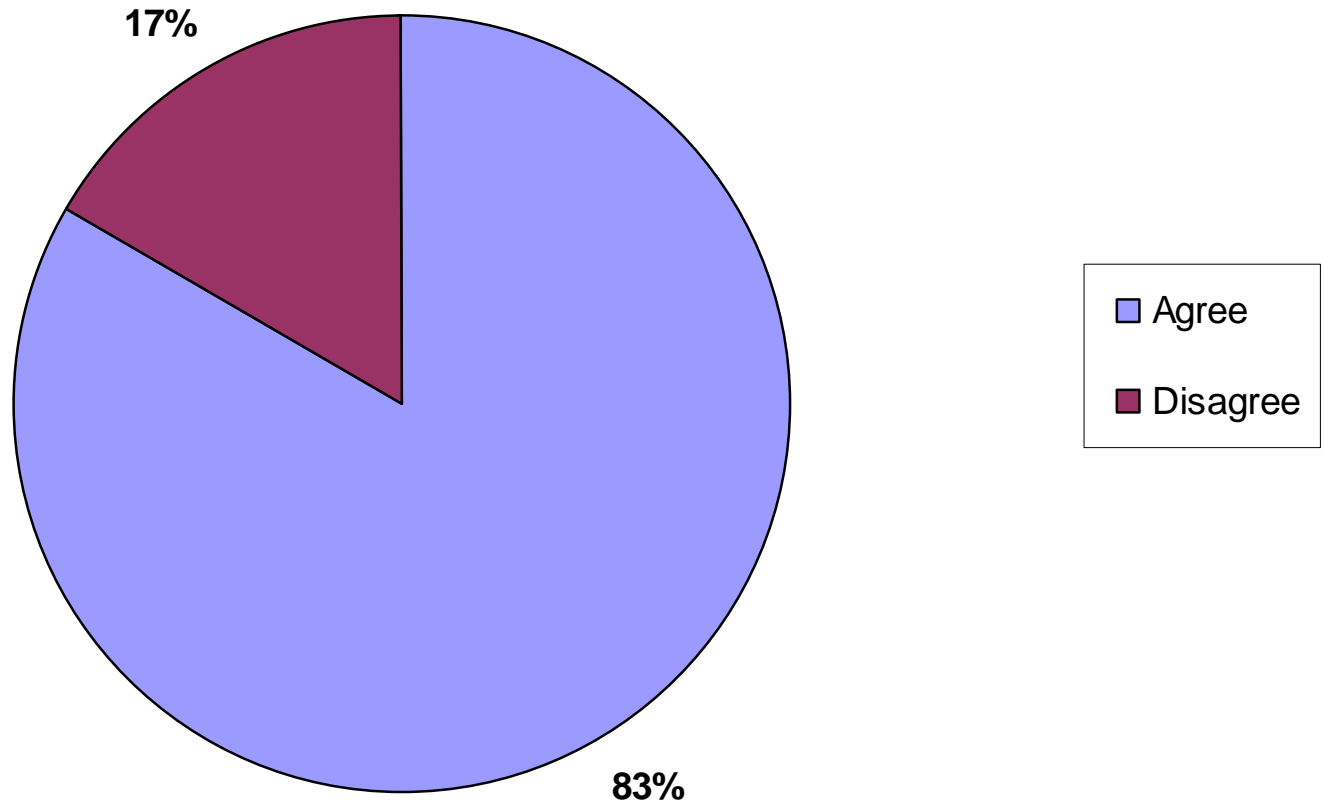
**Question 7: Do you believe the public referendum process (ballot box voting) over new housing developments is producing better residential developments than five years ago?**

**Question Response Rate: 158/170 surveys (93 percent)**



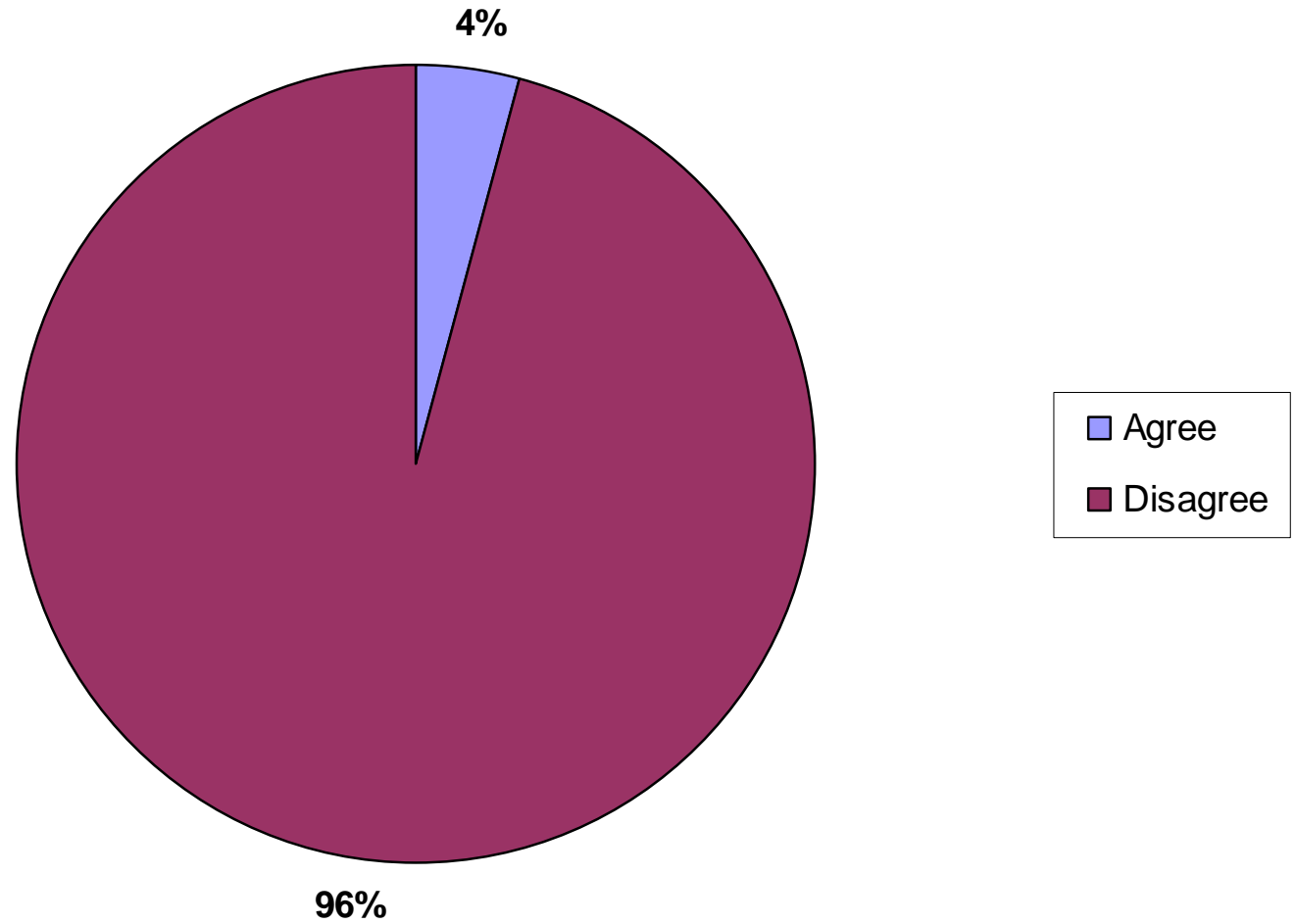
**"I would support increased density in my community in order to protect open space and agricultural land."**

**Question Response Rate: 168/170 surveys (99 percent)**

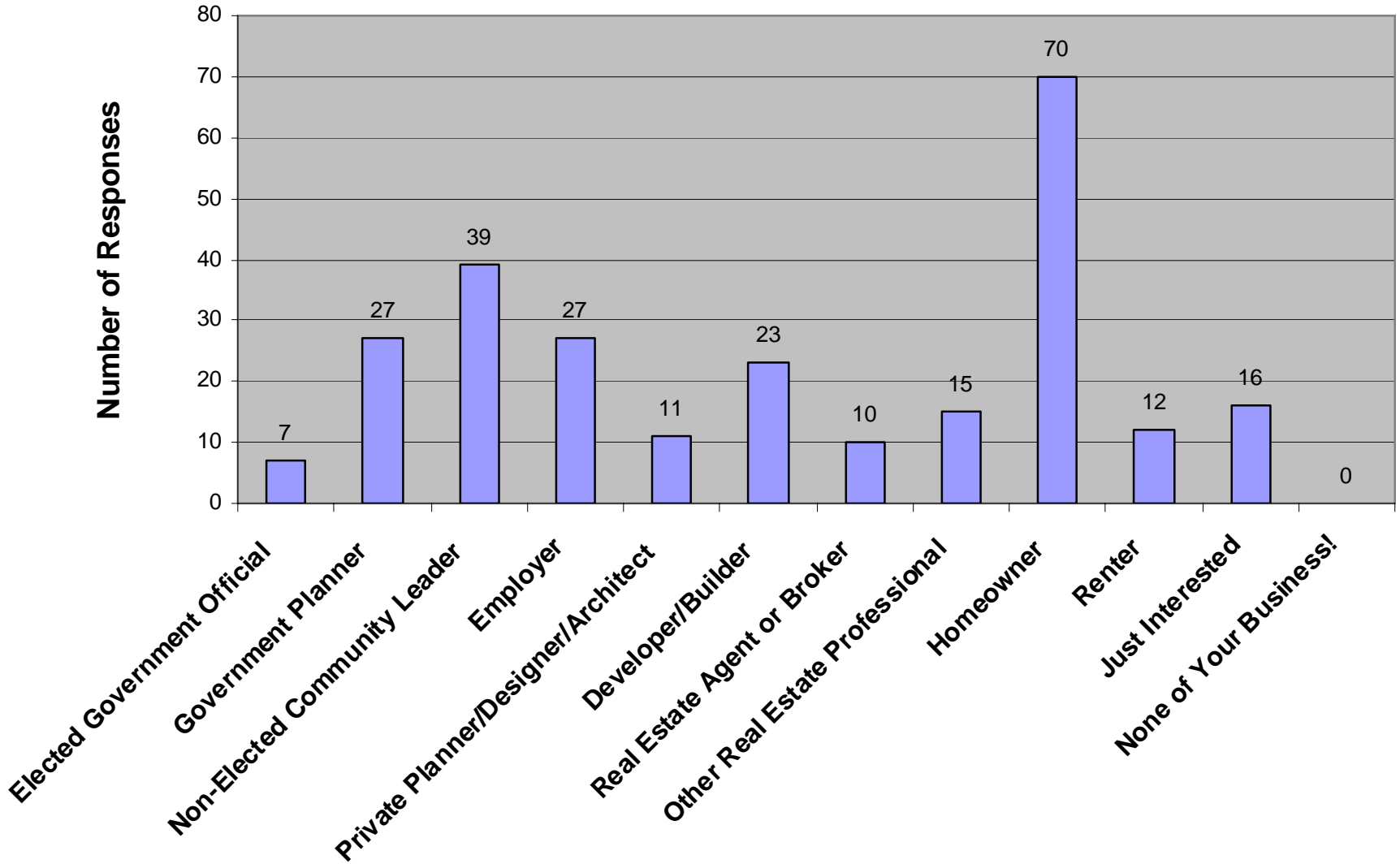


**Question 9: "I got mine, the heck with everyone else!"**
